What you will need*:



*You can substitute any of these supplies with whatever you have at home!

- SmartPhone or Tablet
- 5-6 small toys
- Piece of cardboard or thick paper
- Photo props to hold up paper (ie/ book, napkin holder)
- Flashlight
- Piece of foil
- notebook or small cutting board

Capture your own photographs:

1. View the images from the exhibition and **workshop recording** on our website at www.luag.org/videos
2. **Take a detailed shot of your world.**
 - a. What does your world look like?
 - b. How do you spend the hours in the day?
3. **Photograph your family.**
4. **Use the self-timer** and prop your phone to snap a selfie.
5. **Start small** - Practice composition and light with your toys or things in your home that hold meaning for you.
6. **Photograph your room** - set a timer for 3 minutes and gather 5 things that are the same color.
7. **Photograph your neighborhood** - Consider point of view, lighting, composition.
