# Message from the Director

On August 1, 2018 I began my role as Director after having spent almost 20 years at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. I was drawn to Lehigh for many reasons, among them the impressive art collection, the excitement about the arts in the Lehigh Valley, and the pivotal moment of growth at the University given the *Path to Prominence*, a plan which includes a new College of Health, a renewed focus on student experience, and interdisciplinary research. The past year at the LUAG was filled with dynamic programs and spectacular exhibitions, but also with candid conversations with our staff and stakeholders about who we are, what we do, and why museums matter.

Through two team retreats and ongoing conversations with both Lehigh and our local community we identified five priorities for our work over the next 3 years:

- 1. Create a program strategy that increases engagement
- 2. Increase visibility
- 3. Increase support
- 4. Bolster infrastructure and facilities
- 5. Address staffing needs

We also conducted a deep analysis of our mission statement to determine if it still served our identity, our aims, and our constituents. The outcome of this analysis is a revised mission statement that will guide our work into the foreseeable future:

We advance critical thinking, cultural understanding, and well-being for campus and community through transformative experiences with art.

As you will see in the information that follows, it was a very full year with significant progress. I am excited, and honored, to lead the LUAG into a new and exciting future, and hope that you will join us by visiting the galleries often. We look forward to seeing you, and to hearing how we can make the LUAG an inspiring and irresistible resource in the lives of all we serve.



# CREATE A PROGRAM STRATEGY THAT INCREASES ENGAGEMENT


In FY19 we revised and reinvigorated our approaches exhibitions and programs, making more thoughtful and intentional connections to timely topics that are relevant to our community. We also identified ways in which we could make stronger connections across disciplines, so that a wide range of audiences can benefit from the LUAG through their own studies and interests. Given that exhibitions and programs require months — if not years — of advance planning, we also recommitted ourselves to planning further in advance in order to maximize impact. This new approach will allow us to make more strategic use of resources, garner more engagement and support, and align our work more closely with curricula and local events.

## Lehigh Student Engagement

Students are active agents in their own learning, and are critical partners to the LUAG as we maximize its relevance and impact. We took several key steps in FY19 to increase student engagement. In Spring, 2019 we formed the LUAG Student Advisory Committee, which now meets three times per semester to provide feedback and to design student-centered programming. Student Guides led conversations with the public about works of art at our fall and spring opening receptions, as well as our Open House. We were also delighted that students in the Spring 2019 course ART220: Modern Art created videos in partnership with the Center for Innovation in Teaching and Learning (CITL) about artworks in the permanent collection that are now featured on our website and social media.















#### PRIORITY 2:

### **INCREASE VISIBILITY**

While we are proud that the LUAG is ubiquitous on campus—six galleries, an extensive outdoor sculpture collection, two art storage/collections facilities, and one of the largest art collections in the region—we realized that in many ways we were remarkably invisible. This was due, in part, to a lack of signage on our own buildings, including the Main/ Lower Galleries in Zoellner Arts Center. We also had an outdated, externally-hosted website in critical need of redesign, and we needed to launch the collection online so that both the Lehigh community and the general public could access these great works of art. We also renewed our relationship with the Communications and Marketing Department of the University, tapping their guidance and expertise to increase our reach and make our promotional vehicles more effective.

# Digital Engagement

Website visits and social media engagement all increased, the largest on Instagram between Q1 and Q4:



## Partnership with the Libraries:

We partnered with colleagues in the Lehigh University Libraries to refine our metadata and cataloguing of digital images of the collection, and for the first time we launched over 300 works in the collection online using the platform Artstor.





# New signage for the art galleries on Zoellner Arts Center

We quickly realized that while we are fortunate to have a large amount of foot traffic just outside of our doors, few people actually knew that we were located inside. In the fall of 2018 we designed and applied window decals to the west-facing windows and doors of Zoellner Arts Center to make our presence known.

## Redesign of www.luag.org

We worked closely with the web development and design team in the College of Arts and Sciences to re-imagine and re-design our website. The new website will provide clearer and more user-friendly content, including information about the collection, education programs and events, and exhibitions. The redesigned website will launch in November, 2019. We also archived our previous website, which is now hosted internally at Lehigh as a WordPress site, and will be accessible to the public for those who wish to explore past exhibitions and events

#### PRIORITY 3:

### **INCREASE SUPPORT**

While all museums continually aim to increase support, we have established this as a key priority over the next three years. The LUAG is fortunate to have a diverse collection of over 16,000 works of art, but is in need of resources to properly protect and conserve the collection for future generations. Works of art often require specialized care, including stable climate conditions and storage materials. Further, our aim to digitize and place the collection online requires significant staff time and resources, and we will seek support to make these collections accessible to all. As we develop and implement new education programs and resources, we will also need resources and staff support to reach the audiences that we aim to serve.

#### PRIORITY 4:

### **BOLSTER INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES**

Over the past year, we identified key aspects of our daily work, spaces, and storage that needed attention and improvement. First, we implemented a new structure of regularized meetings, including a weekly team meeting with an agenda that is circulated in advance and created with contributions from the full team. We reorganized and clarified our paper and digital files, and reconfigured our physical offices and gallery spaces to maximize efficiency and impact. In collaboration with Development, Finance and Risk Management we revised and began to implement new and improved procedures for gifts-in-kind, as well as related documentation. With assistance from Facilities, we acquired an additional 900 square feet of collections care and storage space at our Building J facility, and began the process of redesigning our existing conference room at Zoellner to become the LUAG Reading Room in FY20, featuring over 2,000 books and publications available to the public.





#### PRIORITY 5:

### ADDRESS STAFFING NEEDS

People are the greatest asset of any museum. The dedicated team at the LUAG rose to the challenge of implementing new methods and approaches to their work, and contributed their insights, experiences, and ideas to help shape future plans. This was a year of substantial staffing changes. Director Ricardo Viera retired after 44 years of service to Lehigh. Two other staff members, Administrator Denise Stangl and Visitor Services/Museum Education Coordinator Pat McAndrew departed after decades of service.

Given these changes, we implemented a new staffing structure, revised and clarified position descriptions for all staff, and promoted several staff members to better reflect responsibilities. After an extensive national search, we also hired the inaugural Curator of Education, Stacie E. Brennan, who began work at the start of FY20.

We also hired two work-study positions and implemented regularized meetings and training with LUAG Volunteers, including a workshop on crosscultural interpersonal communication skills.





# Looking Ahead

In the coming year we are excited to launch several important projects. We were awarded a two-year federal grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) that will support the creation of a 5-Year Strategic Plan, bring guest experts to campus, and support LUAG staff to travel on study trips to peer institutions in New York City and Philadelphia. We will also present the results of this work at a national conference when the grant concludes in 2021. We will relaunch our website, <a href="https://www.luag.org">www.luag.org</a>, in November, 2019, after having spent over a year developing its redesign. This new website will include the collection online, initially with some 400 artworks from the permanent collection, but will grow to 4,000 artworks by June 30, 2020.

We will also create the inaugural Director's Advisory Council in FY20, a team of trusted experts, advocates, and supporters that will advise us as we implement these changes, and who will also help the LUAG garner increased support. In July, 2020 we will launch the LUAG Membership Program, an initiative that will provide free memberships to Lehigh students, faculty, and staff, and a range of benefits for members who would like to be more deeply engaged with the LUAG.

The 2019-20 academic year at the Lehigh University Art Galleries promises to be filled with exciting growth and change. Come visit our inspiring exhibitions, participate in our thought-provoking programs, and explore everything that the LUAG has to offer. We look forward to seeing you soon.
