

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN VISITING LEHIGH UNIVERSITY ART GALLERIES

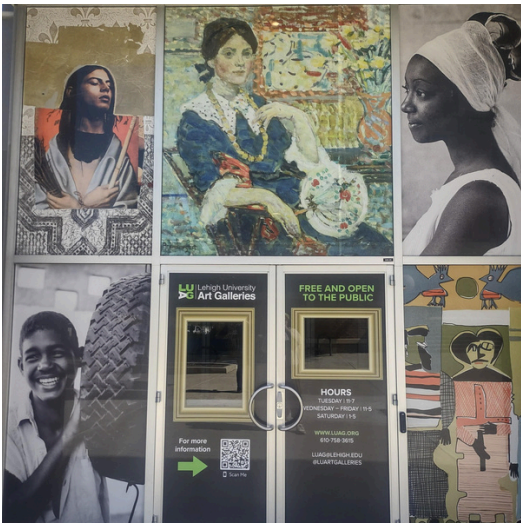


Arriving at the Museum



Today we are visiting Lehigh University Art Galleries inside the Zoellner Arts Center on Lehigh University's campus.

If we rode here in a car, we will park in the parking garage or parking meters along Packer Avenue.



To enter the building, I can walk through either of the doors facing the street or courtyard.



Inside the Museum



When I enter the museum, I will meet the front desk attendant here. I will be asked to sign in at the front desk and can ask questions about the museum and exhibitions.

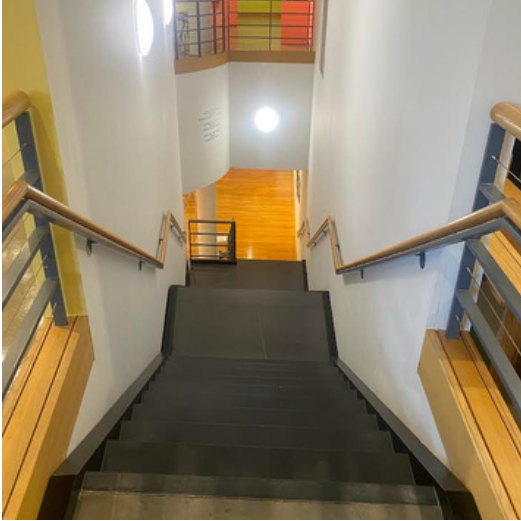


The front desk attendant will ask me to put my backpack and any food or drink in the coat room.

This will help to keep the artwork safe! I can come back at anytime if I need something from this room.



Getting Around the Museum



The museum has two floors. I entered the museum on the first floor - the Main Gallery.

I can explore the upstairs and downstairs of the museum and move between them by using the stairs or elevator.



The elevator may be hard to find in hallway at the back of the gallery. I can ask the front desk attendant to help me go downstairs.

In the Galleries



I can explore the galleries as I like. There are many works of art on the walls and sculptures in cases and on pedestals.

While I explore the gallery, I will remember how to keep the artwork safe:

- I will look at a painting or piece of art from a safe distance - 2 steps is good!
- I will use my eyes - and not my hands - to look at the artwork.
- I will not point at the artwork with hands or pencils.
- I can fold my hands, cross my arms, or hold my hands behind my back while looking at a painting.



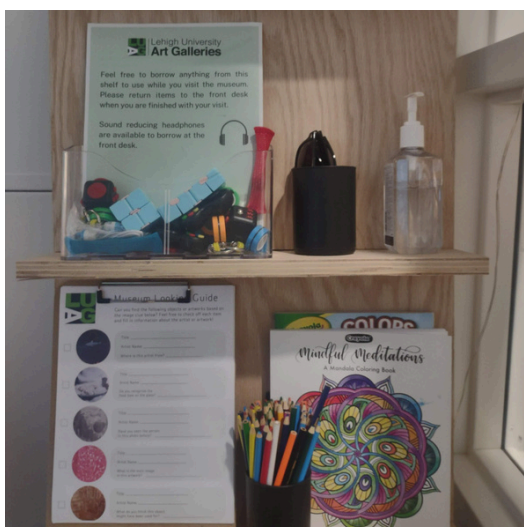
If I would like to explore virtual tours of the gallery before my visit, I can look at those on my computer or phone by scanning the QR code. Some of the artwork may be different when I visit in person.



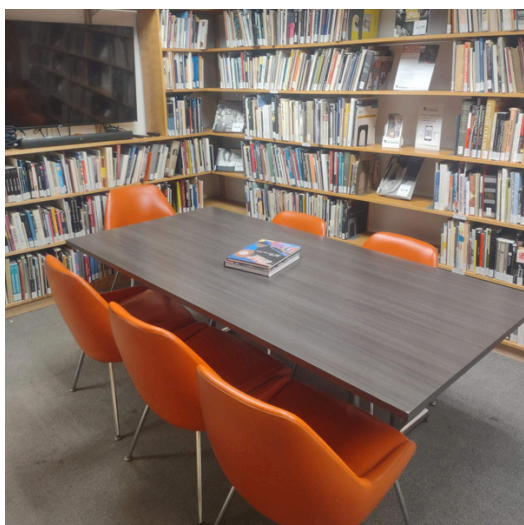
Taking a Break
